Informational Items:

- The Department of Criminal Justice approved a change to our core curriculum in the Master of Criminal Justice (MCJ) program. Starting in AY 25-26, t CRJU 5410: Victim Studies will be required as a core course to replace the current core CRJU 5007: Violence. This change ensures that students in the grad program are learning about victims (in addition to CJ Systems and Policy), and they can still take CRJU 5007: Violence as an elective. The proposed content change will not impact the number of credits, faculty available, or expected timeline for students to finish the degree
- Correction from last month’s agenda: The Physics department has changed the minimum grade requirement to allow one B- grade
- Sociology has made the following changes:
 - Sociology MA Programs agreed to adopt 12 AMP double-counted credits.
 - Sociology changed the AMP GPA requirements to 3.00 overall GPA and 3.33 Sociology GPA.
- The College of Business has made the following changes:
 - all 5000 level foundation courses from the MBA program have been eliminated. The faculty voted to remove these courses to continue to reduce barriers for incoming grad students.
 - Faculty have voted to remove most pre-requisite requirements for COB graduate classes as well as open COB graduate course to all Graduate Students. Courses are no longer limited to College of Business Graduate students only to promote more cross campus collaboration.
- MS in Aerospace Engineering is adding a Streamlined admissions option for students who graduated from the undergraduate program in the last 2 years and have a program GPA of 3.25

- The PhD in Computer Science has expanded the list of Qualifier Course options to include:
 - CS 5500: Operating Systems
 - CS 5300: Software Engineering
 - CS 5720: Algorithms
 - CS 5200: Computer Architecture
 - CS 5985: Cybersecurity Metrics
 - CS 5730: Algorithmic Game Theory
 - CS 5820: Artificial Intelligence (Writing Intensive Course)
 - CS 5800 - Computer Graphics
- The Counseling Program in the College of Education has reduced the number of elective courses available to create consistency for students and faculty. Please see the attached document for the new course sequence.

DATA SOURCE

Data in this dashboard is pulled from Census Date snapshot data (and end-of-term snapshot data when available) from the CU Central Information Warehouse (CIW). Because this data is based on a set point in time, it may not match other sources that are drawn at different points in time or from other data sources such as the Student Information System (SIS). Official Census snapshot datasets are typically available 2 weeks after the University Census date, and end-of-term snapshot datasets are typically available 4 weeks after an academic term ends.

PURPOSE OF VISUALIZATION

This visualization analyzes term enrollment at UCCS by academic plans active during the selected term(s). This counts all active plans of an enrolled student, so they are counted more than once if they have more than one active plan for a given term. Totals are given at both the plan level as well as the sub-plan level. A number of filters are available to analyze this population further.

PURPOSE OF VISUALIZATION

This visualization analyzes graduate student cohorts entering UCCS since Fall 2011. Graduate student cohorts in this visualization are students admitted into a graduate-level program for the first-time via an application (does not include readmits or students entering a program via program changes through the Registrar).

Provides retention rates and graduation rates of these cohorts at the program/plan level as well as demographic analysis of the graduate students in each cohort. A number of filters are available to analyze this population further.

DEFINITIONS

Certificate Program	A recognized credential that is conferred upon the satisfactory completion of an education program. A recognized credential is one that is eligible for Title IV federal student aid. For graduate students, there are two types of certificate programs: Post-baccalaureate Certificate: an award beyond the baccalaureate degree but does not meet the requirement..
Cohorts	Generally refers to new incoming first-year students, but is used in this visualization to identify specific graduate students. For the purposes of this visualization, graduate student cohorts are those who were admitted into a graduate-level program for the first-time via an application. This does not include graduate readmits who are r..
College	The college that owns the program/plan/subplan. If a student is in a dual program, they will show up under both colleges.
Entry Term	For the purposes of this visualization, entry term is the given term that the student applied and began enrollment in the graduate program. Spring means the student applied for a graduate program in the spring term and began enrollment in the same spring term. Sum/Fall means the student applied for the graduate program in either the summer or fall term, and subsequently enrolled in the fall term.
Ethnicity	As of 2010, race/ethnicity categories were changed in accordance with the Office of Management and Budget's Standards for Maintaining, Collecting, and Presenting Federal Data on Race and Ethnicity which was posted to the Federal Register by the U.S. Department of Education. New reporting categories include the following: Nonresident Alien, Hispanic, American Indian or Alaska Native, Asian, Black or African American, Native Hawai..
Full-Time	For graduate students, full-time is 5 or more credit hours per term or if they are enrolled in dissertation credits. For this visualization, this designation is based on their entry term.
Gender	Colorado law (HB 19-1039 or "Jude's Law") allows Coloradans to designate their sex as male, female, or X (neither male nor female) on their driver's license, Colorado birth certificate, or Colorado state ID. Called "Gender" in many Student Information Systems.

The data in this dashboard connects to live data in order to capture the most up-to-date admission information; however, this visualization only gets updated every Saturday evening at 11:00 pm. Note the "Current as of: " text at the bottom of each tab to confirm when the report was last updated.

ABOUT THIS DASHBOARD

The report was created for our university to monitor the application process, monitor trends, anticipate new student enrollment, and to see the diversity of our new students.

The Overall tab displays the number of applicants, admitted, matriculated, and enrolled students over the past 12 years.

The Admit Category tab breaks down the incoming students by admit type over the past 12 years. Change the admission stage by choosing applicants, admits, matriculations, or admits-enrolled from the dropdown filter.

The Admission Funnel tab shows the current number of applicants, admits, matriculations, or admits-enrolled by the current week, which is how many weeks out from the main campus census date we currently are. It compares the current numbers with the final numbers among the past 5 academic years. New terms for each semester will automatically show up once they are less than 60 weeks out from the main campus census date.

NOTE: Applications have been reduced to show only one application per student per semester and is reflective of applicants and not applications submitted.

DASHBOARD NAVIGATION

Hover your mouse over the graphics for data details.

Use the filters on the left to focus on specific populations. After making multiple selections, click the Apply button.

Click on the Reset Filters button to clear all filters.

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Use the + and - buttons to zoom in and then pan over to see values more clearly. When finished, click the home icon to reset the view.

Use the download button in the upper right corner to export. For an Excel format, choose the Crosstab option.

Admission Stage	The stage the student is at within the admission process such as applied, admitted, matriculated, or enrolled.
Admit Category	It groups applications together by admit type such as freshman, transfer, master, doctorate, readmit, or non-degree.
Admit Type	Admit Types are codes attached to student applications which represent types of admission criteria to facilitate the admissions process. Admit types are not used to determine a student's cohort a..
Admit-Enrolled	Applicant who was admitted, matriculated and then enrolled in at least one class during their admit term. Denotes a new, incoming student enrollment only.
Admitted	Applicant who is offered admission to a degree or certificate-granting program at UCCS.
