- English Proficiency Requirements (check requirements)- Ruby Cheng
 - The international recruitment staff would like to ensure that all websites and documents have the correct score requirements for TOEFL, IELTS, or KITE (previously ACTcompass test). Please review the attached document to ensure that your program’s scores are accurate (if not completed at meeting). Follow-up by emailing Ruby Cheng at ycheng@uccs.edu.
 - Ruby is also able to send out sample tests to programs so they can see the type of material that prospective students are being tested on in each of the ESL examinations.

- Graduate Executive Committee: Purpose/Role, Membership (see graduate school rules)
 - May GEC: when reviewing revisions to GS policies and procedures, we were asked to bring back the issue about GEC—role and purpose, membership
 - Please see below for current policy wording. The current wording is unclear on who can vote and how many votes can be given by each department/college. This is due to different uses of the word program, department, track, etc.
 - The question posed is should we change the wording OR have a different system in how we run the meetings. Currently, faculty who attend meeting are able to vote. This can mean an uneven representation of colleges or departments at different meetings (see table below for last year’s total voting members invited and total attended)

- The Committee determined that some clarity was needed. Specifically, it was discussed to have a set list of number of votes per department, but that departments would like to have freedom to send unnamed faculty representative. The committee requested the graduate school bring forward some updated wording to a future GEC meeting and a list of programs/departments. The Committee wanted the graduate school dean to stay the chair.
- Student appeal process (see proposed changes)
 - There was a discussion specific to authority for the final decision in an appeals case. It was recommended that the Student Affairs Committee would be the final deciding entity for the appeal process. The process would no longer go to the Dean of the Graduate School for final decision.
 - It was also noted that if the appeal was about a decision from the Graduate School (e.g., Provisional admit and removal, fellowships/scholarships, Graduation) that a chair from GEC membership would be appointed by the Provost and committee selection for that appeal would occur by the Chair.

Sections of Policy related to make-up and purpose of GEC

Article I

Section C: Graduate Faculty

The graduate faculty is responsible for academic and curricular decisions regarding graduate education at the University of Colorado Colorado Springs. Graduate faculty empowers the Graduate Executive Committee to oversee the operations of the Graduate School.

Section E: Graduate School Executive Committee

1. **Composition** of the Graduate Executive Committee: The Graduate Executive Committee consists of the following members:
 - a. Graduate School Dean (Chair)
 - b. Faculty representative from each graduate program, normally the program director. Each program representative has one vote in the Graduate Executive Committee (programs with master's and doctoral degrees have one vote)
 - c. A representative of the library faculty (non-voting member)
2. **Responsibilities:** The Graduate Executive Committee focuses on the issues of graduate education including, but not limited to, student affairs, curriculum development, and academic transactions. In particular, the Graduate Executive Committee will:
 - a. Approve policies and procedures of the Graduate School (Note that some policies may require further approval by the UCCS Faculty Assembly, the Provost and Executive Vice Chancellor for Academic Affairs, the Chancellor, the University of Colorado System office, or the Regents)
 - b. Review all proposals for new graduate programs, new program options/tracks/concentrations/areas of emphasis, and make recommendations to the Provost and Executive Vice Chancellor for Academic Affairs
 - c. Review proposals for significant modification of existing curricula and make recommendations to the Provost and Executive Vice Chancellor for Academic Affairs (a significant modification will be at the discretion of the Graduate School dean and could include items such as credit hour changes, course overlaps, core course requirements, etc.)

Article I. Section F: Standing Committees of the Graduate Executive Committee

The following standing committee is appointed by and responsible to the Graduate Executive Committee:

The Student Affairs Committee is a four-member subcommittee of the Graduate Executive Committee, and one student representative appointed by the Graduate School Dean ~~with the approval of the Graduate Executive Committee.~~ This committee is responsible for hearing student problems and appeals. The Student Affairs Committee will not accept appeals concerning grades or program admission decisions. The committee meets as required.

ARTICLE VI: GRADUATE STUDENT APPEALS

Section A: Final Responsibility

1. All appeals regarding course grades or admission decisions shall follow the procedures established by the school/college in which the course was taken or the admission decision was rendered.
2. Final authority on appeals submitted by graduate students concerning actions (other than grading or admissions decisions) taken by faculty members, program directors, ~~the Graduate School Dean~~ academic college/school dean, or other administrative officials, rests with the Graduate ~~Executive Committee~~ School dean. If ~~such an~~ appeal involves a matter affecting two or more University of Colorado campuses, the final action rests with the Provost and Executive Vice Chancellor of Academic Affairs.

Section B: Student Appeal Procedures

The procedures for a student appeal to the Graduate School Dean and the Graduate Executive Committee are:

1. An appeal will be officially accepted from a student only after it has been determined that the student has exhausted the appeals process in effect in the program, department, school, and college.
2. If a resolution to the problem identified in the student's appeal cannot be reached on the department or unit level, the student may submit a written appeal to the Graduate School Dean. The written appeal must describe in detail the basis in fact for the opinion that the student has been treated unfairly academically and must describe actions taken to resolve the problem at the departmental level.
3. Upon receipt of a written appeal from a student, the Graduate School Dean will contact the appropriate departmental officer to get a response to the questions or objections raised by the student. In some cases, a written response from the department may be requested. The response and appeal is then sent to the Student Affairs Committee of the Graduate Executive Committee. This committee acts in an advisory capacity to the Graduate School Dean and will forward their findings and recommendations to the Graduate School Dean.

The Graduate School Dean will make a decision in the case. The decision from the



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Graduate School Dean is final. ~~This decision may be appealed by either party to the full Graduate Executive Committee, but only if the decision of the Graduate School Dean is in disagreement with the recommendation of the Student Affairs Committee. In this case, the decision of the Graduate Executive Committee is final.~~
